Largest Operating Endowment Gift Ever



COVID Phase 3 Grants

Phase 3 COVID response grants, approved by the HCCF Board of Directors in December 2020, provided **\$40,000** (\$10,000 each) to four local nonprofits: Family Promise of Hendricks County, the Hendricks County Food Pantry Coalition, Hendricks County Senior Services, and WorkOne. These grants were designed to support areas of need in our community still



impacted by the coronavirus, including food insecurity, homelessness, support for seniors, and unemployment. Read more <u>here</u>.

Because of generous donors, both individuals and organizations, the Community Foundation has been able to provide grants of over \$575,000 to support our community in dealing with the difficulties of COVID-19.

Grants for the Day-to-Day

HCCF awarded **\$191,848** in grants this month to organizations in every corner of Hendricks County to support education, agriculture, health and human services, parks and recreation, senior services and more! These grants were made by our Designated Funds, funds established by donors with a passion to support an organization important to them. These funds make grants every year to an organization chosen by the donor and provide essential operational support that allows them to better serve our community.

Here is just a small sample of these impactful grants:

- Avon-Washington Township Public Library Fund: \$3,618 to support the Avon Library
- Comer Family Leadership Fund: \$1,977 to Leadership Hendricks County
- Jackie Eggers Memorial Fund for Children: \$2,278 to Mill Creek Community School Corp.
- Glen & Mildred Harlos Fund: \$44,513 to Parks Foundation of Hendricks County for support of <u>McCloud Park</u>
- Sycamore Services/Hendricks County ARC Fund: \$3,056 to <u>Sycamore Services</u> for general operating
