

#### **Year Two of ARPA Grants**

The Community Foundation, in cooperation with the County Council and Commissioners, created a grant program in 2022 to distribute up to \$6.6 million of American Rescue Plan Act funds allotted to Hendricks County.

In the second year of ARPA grant applications, the HCCF Program Committee recommended \$564,789 in competitive grants, distributed late in 2023.

One of the grant recipients was Hendricks County Special Olympics who received \$11,730 to fund dance and equestrian programming and to purchase uniforms, and track and bowling supplies. Click here to read the list of all the nonprofit recipients.
