You know how you feel when you've got exciting news, but can't share it just yet? That's the way I've been feeling the past few months - filled with anticipation and just bursting to tell! Now I can finally share with you some of our exciting news.

The first item is HCCF's recent hiring of Bryan Chatfield as our Community Inclusion & Engagement Manager. See more below on Bryan. This is the first new role HCCF has added since I joined the Community Foundation in 2012. The genesis of the position goes back to our 2019 Needs Assessment which revealed that we were not reaching significant portions of our community. We reached out to partner organizations and discovered that they didn't have those relationships either. With our goal of making Hendricks County a better place, we realized we need to include everyone in our work and that led us to this new scope of work. I hope you'll join me in welcoming Bryan to HCCF and Hendricks County!

The second item I'm excited about is related to the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). We've been in discussions with the county about helping the County Commissioners distribute funds from ARPA to nonprofits. In late April, we finalized a Memorandum of Understanding with the Commissioners to provide our expertise to create a grants program for up to 20% of the County's ARPA funds - a total of up to \$6.6 million! The County Commissioners and Council will be making the final funding decisions based on recommendations from HCCF and the Hendricks County ARPA Planning Committee. You'll be hearing more about this as the details emerge, but this can be a gamechanger for many nonprofits in our community and the people they serve!

There's more I'm excited to share, but I will save some news for next month! Until then, thank you so much for your support of HCCF!
