ARPA Grant Applications Open on June 5th

HCCF is working with the Hendricks County Commissioners to assist with the distribution of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to nonprofits working in Hendricks County. Working with the county's ARPA Planning Committee, the Community Foundation designed a process to distribute approximately \$1.5 million through a three-year competitive grant cycle.

The second grant cycle was completed in 2023. The last cycle of competitive grants will be offered this year with the application period starting June 5, 2024.
