The past year has been eventful for the Community Foundation. We completed a 2022 Needs Assessment, a Community Behavioral Health Plan, a new strategic plan, a Nonprofit Learning Series, and awarded Community Unity grants. We partnered with county government to help distribute \$6.6 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grants to nonprofits working in our community. Bryan Chatfield, our Community Inclusion & Engagement Manager, joined our team in May, opening a new scope of work for us, reaching out in new ways to diverse populations in our county. And we distributed over \$1.6 million in grants and scholarships from the funds that generous people have started with us over our nearly 30-year history.

As we look forward to 2023 we have some exiting plans. We'll be releasing the results of the Needs Assessment refresh shortly after the new year. Our partnerships with Leadership Hendricks County and the Parks Foundation of Hendricks County will be more robust. Competitive ARPA grants will again be available in the summer. And we'll be working through some exciting parts of the first year of our strategic plan.

At its simplest, our mission is to make Hendricks County a better place. We do that by being a trusted community partner in understanding needs, aligning resources, and empowering people to address today's priorities and create lasting impact together. We did that in 2022 and looking forward to continuing our work in 2023.

We couldn't do any of this good work without the generous people who have supported our work for almost 30 years. I pause to thank them for helping make our community a better place.
