No one would have ever thought that a few dedicated people in Hendricks County would start a fund at the Community Foundation and become a game-changer in the fight against homelessness. But that is exactly what Family Promise has done and is continuing to do.

This summer, the Community Foundation awarded Family Promise a \$25,000 grant from the Deedee Daniel Opportunity Fund and our Family Legacy Funds to purchase their new home in Plainfield. Because of our generous donors, HCCF has been able to provide over \$85,000 in grants to support Family Promise since 2013. In 2018 alone, 95 Hendricks County families graduated from the program into homes and jobs of their own.
