TO OUR DONORS



Dear Friends of the Hendricks County Community Foundation,

Thank you for making 2019 a spectacular year for your Community Foundation! HCCF set records in fundraising, grantmaking and nonprofit capacity building that include:

- gifts and contributions totaling over \$5.6 million;
- grants and scholarships totaling over \$1.6 million were awarded to nonprofits and individual students;
- two nonprofit learning series for over 50 local nonprofit leaders in:
 - marketing and social media; and
 - fundraising (*read more about our partnership with The Fund Raising School on page 11*); and
- a conservatively managed endowment portfolio with remarkable gains of 17.09%.

As the cover of the report states, we spent much of the year “Defining Needs, Leading Change” throughout Hendricks County thanks to Lilly Endowment Inc. GIFT VII grants. GIFT VII had two parts: a Matching Phase and a Community Leadership Phase.

In the Matching Phase, HCCF received \$1.1 million to match new gifts to our Community Enhancement Funds by December 31, 2020. We were humbled by our community’s response and came very close to raising the entire \$550,000 needed to complete the match in 2019. (2020 spoiler alert: we completed the match in February 2020!)

The second part of GIFT VII was made up of two additional grants from Lilly Endowment called Community Leadership Grants:

- \$100,000 Planning Grant received in 2019; and,
- \$200,000 Implementation Grant we anticipate receiving in 2020.

We used the Planning Grant to conduct a county-wide needs assessment. Read more on the Planning Grant and needs assessment on pages 12-13. 2019 was a year of new vision for community unity and health led by HCCF in partnership with other community leaders. Together we laid the groundwork to turn that vision into reality. We know this is not the end, but just the beginning—a new era of Community Foundation leadership in Hendricks County pursuing the community’s greatest opportunities and addressing its most critical challenges.

We are thankful for the continued support of long-time donors, our many volunteers, new friends of the Community Foundation, and our dedicated professional staff. Our Board is committed to realizing our vision of Hendricks County as a vibrant, giving community. Join us today!

Making a Legacy Fund Part of Your Story

Fifty-three Hendricks County families know the power for good in HCCF Family Legacy Funds and have made us a part of their story. A Family Legacy Fund is a Community Enhancement Fund that allows a family to permanently support their community while honoring their family name.

These funds are a powerful tool for good because they provide the funds for HCCF to make grants to current and emerging needs in our community—needs that might not be met otherwise. We are grateful to the families listed on page 6 who started Family Legacy Funds and wanted a legacy for good to become part of their story.

Family Legacy Funds at Work in 2019

From October 2018 through December 2019, families had the opportunity to triple their gifts to Family Legacy Funds through the Lilly Endowment GIFT VII, which matched all donations made to Community Enhancement Funds \$2 to \$1! In 2019, 18 families started Family Legacy Funds at HCCF, tripled their gifts, and together all the HCCF Legacy Funds awarded grants of over \$37,000 to meet needs in our community, including the following:



Building Capacity Among Local Nonprofits

2019 marked the fourth year of HCCF's Nonprofit Learning Series which provided high quality training and networking opportunities for nonprofits who serve Hendricks County. Trainings were open to staff, board members, and volunteers in the community.

Marketing & Social Media Series



In the first half of the year, the Community Foundation led a free four-part Marketing and Social Media learning series. HCCF brought in digital marketing and social media experts from Circle Social Inc. and CVR to teach nonprofit leaders effective marketing and social media techniques. Out of the 50 total attendees, seven community leaders completed all four courses, including Helee Adkins of Hendricks County Senior Services. She said, **"This series helped me refresh my fundamentals in marketing, apply it to my current role with Hendricks County Senior Services, and further develop my social media skills. I appreciate Hendricks County Community Foundation bringing this interactive series to our local community."**

The Fund Raising School: CFRM Program

In the latter part of the year, HCCF partnered with The Fund Raising School of the IU Lilly Family School of Philanthropy to offer the four-part Certificate in Fund Raising Management (CFRM) program. Typically, this program costs approximately \$5,800; however, thanks to the partnership with the School of Philanthropy and funding from the Deedee Daniel Opportunity Fund, nonprofits only had to pay \$500 for the series. All who complete the four courses will receive their CFRM, an internationally recognized credential in effective fundraising. Lora Steele, Program Implementation Director of Hendricks County Economic Development Partnership said, **"I have appreciated the opportunity to participate in this program. I'm able to use what I've learned in my job with Economic Development, in my positions on local nonprofit boards, as well as my personal philanthropic endeavors. From relationship building to understanding how various funds should be raised, this course has provided so much. Thank you Community Foundation for offering this course to our community!"**

Community Leadership Initiative

March 2019: Planning Grant Submitted

HCCF submitted the Lilly Endowment GIFT VII Planning Grant application and began the process to bring together the people and resources needed to create a compelling Implementation Grant application and move our county forward.

August 2019: One-on-One’s

To get a general understanding of the needs in our community. We met individually with **58** community leaders, business owners and nonprofit directors representing a wide-range of industries as well as each corner of the county.

September 2019: Focus Groups

We hosted six general focus groups that included **69** different leaders and a 7th focus group with an additional **29** members of the Hendricks County Food Pantry Coalition. The focus groups were designed to understand participants’ concerns about their communities, resources available to address those concerns, barriers to accessing those services and possible solutions.

🌿 October 2019: Community Needs Assessment

We created a 19-question Community Needs Assessment with the goal of obtaining community-wide input regarding the most pressing needs of our community.

Within 5 weeks, we received **3,048** completed survey responses. Based upon standard statistical measures, we achieved a 99 percent confidence level that the participants in this survey accurately represent the population of Hendricks County.

🌿 December 2019: Community Needs Reveal

HCCF staff presented the summary of results from the Community Needs Assessment at our Reveal. **133** community members attended this event and were given the opportunity to ask clarifying questions as well as share their thoughts on the results of the survey.

🌿 January 2020: Addressing the Needs: Conversations on Community Unity and Healthy Communities

We held two, two-part conversations titled Addressing the Needs: A Conversation on Community Unity and Healthy Communities. These were two issues we determined the community could address with its funding opportunity from Lilly Endowment.

The first part of the conversation brought **133** community leaders together to define the current state, default future and necessary outcomes for success for Community Unity and Healthy Communities.

The second part brought together over **148** community leaders to work on outcomes and tactics for Community Unity and Healthy Communities.

🌿 February 2020: Task Force Meetings

At the conclusion of each Community Conversation, a task force of community leaders was elected to hone the information and create the grant applications for each issue-Community Unity and Healthy Communities.

🌿 March 2020: Grant Applications Submitted!

Through the entire Community Leadership Initiative, our community has come together in incredible ways to understand the needs in our community and come up with creative ways to solve them. **The Community Leadership Timeline accounts for over 2,200 hours from people all across Hendricks County, which equates to over \$55,000* in volunteer time!**



HCCF Awards Largest Grant in its History to Cascade Youth League



Amo has only 422 residents, but the Cascade Youth League serves more than 300 players from all over the Mill Creek area each year, from 3-year-olds to middle-schoolers. Young athletes have played baseball and softball at diamonds in the Amo community for four decades, but the old park was deteriorating and flooded easily.

At the April 2019 meeting, the Community Foundation's Board of Directors approved the largest grant in the organization's 26-year history. The \$750,000 grant from an anonymous donor advised fund at the Community Foundation was made to the Cascade Youth League for the new Brian Burch Memorial Sports Park. The project will breathe new life into youth sports in Amo and the Mill Creek Community.

The donors made a substantial gift to their donor advised fund so that the grant could be made anonymously to the Youth League. Anonymity is important to them because they want the recognition to go to God, not to their family. A donor advised fund at HCCF allows donors and their families to be involved in grantmaking by making grant recommendations to the HCCF Board.

The new sports park, completed in April 2020 on the location of the former fields, features four new diamonds, bleachers, dugouts, fencing, lighting, concession stands and field drainage. The drainage is especially critical since the old fields flooded so often that the kids couldn't play for weeks at a time.

In addition to the grant, the donors challenged the Youth League to raise matching funds (a \$3 to \$1 match) to see the \$1.1 million project to completion. The community came together to make additional gifts and make certain the project was completed.

Nic Allen, President of the Cascade Youth League said, "I'm not sure I have enough words to tell you how excited we are and how grateful we are for this contribution." HCCF partners with generous people to "hit home runs" like this all across our community through grant making that makes our community a better place to live, work and play.



Ben Fouch - Giving Back Home Again in Indiana



Growing up in a large family, Ben Fouch felt driven to achievement and forging his own path early in life. He grew up in Hendricks County, attended St. Malachy and graduated from Brownsburg High School in 2013. He was awarded the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship from HCCF and graduated from Notre Dame, earning a double major in finance and political science.

Ben firmly believes that his status as a Lilly Scholar gave him credibility and paved the way for him to participate in many different programs on campus, including the opportunity to apply for and receive the Heshburgh-Yusko Scholarship. Ben is one of only the three residents of Indiana to ever win this scholarship. *(Fun fact: Alexis Green, 2015 HCCF Lilly Scholar also received the scholarship.)*

After graduation, Ben worked for a Fortune 200 company in Washington, D.C. for two years. While he enjoyed the diversity and culture of the city, he missed his hometown. In 2019, he moved back to Indiana and accepted a director position with LDI Ltd. in Indianapolis. He is currently pursuing his Masters in Industrial Engineering at Georgia Tech.

Ben said his biggest draw in coming back to Indiana was the balanced life that his home state offers. In DC, people were driven by money and status and seemed to be stuck on a pre-determined path dictated by the culture. "But life in Hendricks County is not that way," says Ben. "Living here allows you to choose your own path, and Hendricks County is one of the most generous places in the country. The people are open and supportive of each other and their desire to build things, make changes and live the life they want. The social capital here is unmatched, and the strong interconnected community makes the difference."

Ben recognizes how much has been invested in him and wants to give back to his community in gratitude. He is now serving as a Board Member of the Community Foundation. He said, "**We all need to be engaged and intentional about growing our community, innovating and developing our people and resources, and investing in where we live.**" People were willing to invest in him, and he is now investing his time, talent and treasures back in Hendricks County. We are grateful for the opportunity to invest in Ben through the Lilly Scholarship program and that he is now giving back to our community as a volunteer leader at HCCF!



