Dear Friends and Neighbors,

2016 proved to be another remarkable year for your Community Foundation! We engaged our community in new and exciting ways; we celebrated our 20th anniversary as a county-wide organization; and we made effective grants to a variety of philanthropic causes in our community. Thank you to the donors who made our successful year possible.

As part of our strategic plan, in 2016 the Community Foundation's Board of Directors embarked on a complete review of our governing documents, including our mission and vision statements, bylaws and other documents, as well as refreshing our logo, website and branding. You can read of some of those changes in this report, while our governing documents can be found at our new website at www.hendrickscountycf.org.

The Board adopted a bold new vision statement that will guide our work moving forward – Hendricks County is a vibrant, giving community – as well as a new mission statement that better describes our role in the community – The Hendricks County Community Foundation partners with generous people to realize their charitable goals while addressing community needs in meaningful and lasting ways. We feel these refreshed statements add clarity to our work as we continue to create a positive impact in Hendricks County.

At the end of March, we completed our Lilly Endowment GIFT VI campaign. We raised over \$1.5 million from generous people in our community for a total impact of over \$3 million. Many of these donations started or added to Legacy Funds – unrestricted funds that will benefit our community for generations to come. We are indebted to Lilly Endowment for their challenge grant and very grateful for all the generous people in Hendricks County and beyond. Thank you!

Our unrestricted grantmaking for 2016 focused on partnering with our local nonprofits to build their institutional capacity. This played out in many exciting ways, including our monthly Nonprofit Learning Series, professional development and other capacity building grants, and our exciting new event Get Involved. You'll find more information on this program inside this report.

This past year, with contributions from generous donors and grant dollars from our endowed funds, the Board approved grants and scholarships totaling over \$865,000 benefiting a wide variety of projects and nonprofits serving many Hendricks County citizens. The projects and programs supported by our grantmaking included a wide range of activities touching almost every area of our community. Programs in the arts, community enhancement, education, health & human services, parks & recreation, and youth all received broad support.



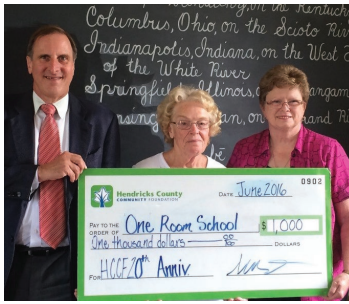

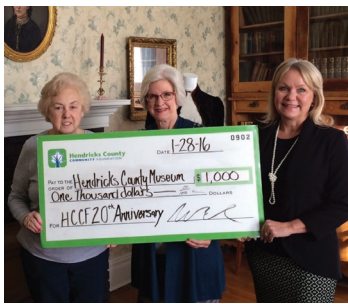

Show Love For Where You Live

Hendricks County lost a great friend last year when Fred Raths of Avon passed away on June 11, 2016. With his passing at age 87, our community lost a humble and anonymous benefactor. He and his late wife Bonnie, who died in 2007, had an incredible impact on our community through the anonymous grants they made from the Raths Family Fund, which they established in 1999 at the Community Foundation.

Fred was born October 31, 1928, in Quincy, Illinois, to John and Mary Ellen Raths, immigrants from Switzerland. Fred graduated from Quincy High School in 1946 and studied at the University of Illinois, graduating with a Bachelors in Chemistry in 1950. At the University of Illinois, he met the love of his life, Bonnie Puls Raths, and they married in 1951. Soon after, he and Bonnie moved to Iowa City, Iowa, where Fred continued his education obtaining his Masters and Doctorate degrees in Organic Chemistry from the University of Iowa. After graduation, Fred began work as a research chemist for Dow Chemical in Midland, Michigan. In 1958, he moved his young family to Memphis, Tennessee, to start work at Buckman Laboratories. Fred worked for Buckman Laboratories for 31 years before retiring in 1989 as Vice President of Operations.

In 1997, Fred and Bonnie moved to Avon to be closer to their son Richard and his family. They were always active as volunteers and enjoyed serving the community together. Fred delivered meals for Meals on Wheels to the elderly and handicapped, and they were members of Messiah Lutheran Church in Brownsburg as well as Kingsway Christian Church in Avon.

Deedee Daniel, the first Executive Director of HCCF, remembers when Fred and Bonnie stopped in to her office in Plainfield. Deedee recalls their first meeting, “I usually worked with people that I already knew in the community, but it was different with the Raths. They just walked in the door and said, ‘We’d like to talk with you about the Community Foundation.’” Fred told her the reason behind their visit, “Bonnie and I believe very strongly we need to give back where we’re living.”

“They didn’t really know what they wanted to do with their giving in Hendricks County,” Deedee said, “which is why they came to the Community Foundation.” They found a perfect fit in a donor advised fund, which offers power and flexibility to the donor while accessing the deep expertise of HCCF. Donor advised funds also provide the opportunity to involve other family members in the grantmaking decision process. “Once the fund was established, Fred and Bonnie would gather with their children and grandchildren at Christmas to go over grant applications and decide where the grant money would go.”

Fred and Bonnie made all their grants from the Raths Family Fund anonymously to support a variety of causes close to their hearts. They wanted to support organizations and projects primarily in Hendricks County, but not to the exclusion of worthwhile projects that may reach outside of the county. They desired to fund programming that helps people in need, improves health and wellness, supports community enhancement, and projects that affect the largest groups of people. Fred also provided a substantial gift during the recent GIFT VI campaign for HCCF to use as a challenge grant to encourage new gifts to unrestricted funds.



Fred and Bonnie partnered with HCCF to extend their impact because of our grant-making expertise and knowledge of our community, while also trusting us to maintain their anonymity. Fred and Bonnie's children graciously consented to publishing this tribute.

In an interview in July 2014, Fred explained that they also started the fund because of the lasting quality of endowed funds at the Community Foundation. "A permanent fund means we can give back to our community every year while preserving our original investment."

A permanent donor advised fund like the Raths Family Fund will forever be part of positive change in Hendricks County. Even without any additional gifts, the Raths Family Fund will continue to offer substantial grants every year to charitable programming. After about 25 years, more will have been granted from the fund than was originally gifted to the Community Foundation, and the principal of the fund will continue forever.

As Deedee put it recently, "To me, the Raths Fund is the epitome of somebody saying, 'Wherever we live, we're going to be part of the community, and we're giving back.' Fred and Bonnie were devoted community servants, caring neighbors, and a great team."

William Rhodehamel, HCCF's current Executive Director, never met Bonnie, but he came to know Fred well over the last four years of his life. "I'd take him to lunch and we'd talk for two or three hours about different projects and how his grantmaking could lead to better outcomes for our community. He was sharp as a tack and focused on where he could make a difference. Fred was remarkable. He never wanted recognition for his giving or grantmaking. His generosity humbled me."

Fred and Bonnie are survived by their son and daughter and their spouses, Richard and Carmen Raths, and Susan and Scott Hooper, and four grandchildren: Bradford, Jeremy, Sarah and Meredith. As Fred's obituary stated, "Fred was a devoted husband, loving father and grandfather. He was very proud of his Swiss heritage and never forgot his family roots. His profound impact – on the community in which he lived and on the lives of his family and friends – will be dearly missed and forever remembered with much love and gratitude."

With Fred and Bonnie's gifts, HCCF will be able to preserve and grow their legacy, ensuring that their contributions to our community will continue forever.

Big Impact Made with Common Cents

You might wonder, “What kind of impact could \$12 have in our community?” The Operation Round-Up Fund, established by Hendricks Power Cooperative in 1999, is an example of how small drops can make big ripples. When Hendricks Power members choose to round up their monthly bill to the nearest dollar, no more than \$12 per year, their “drops” add up to big impact in Hendricks County.

“It is amazing how these small individual donations have added up over the past 17 years,” said Dana Cochran, Marketing VP at Hendricks Power. Since the Operation Round-Up Fund was established, almost \$121,000 has been raised from gifts smaller than \$12. And these gifts have led to nearly \$119,000 in grants to 57 projects in Hendricks County.

“Operation Round-Up is a valuable program in our community,” said William Rhodehamel, HCCF Executive Director. “In 2016, Operation Round-Up made \$6,000 in grants to organizations like Susie’s Place for law enforcement interview equipment and Misty Eyes Animal Shelter for their building campaign. Operation Round-Up has been serving the community with us for 17 years, and together we have helped complete numerous projects for the community and local nonprofit organizations.” Although Operation Round-Up prioritizes grants related to utility issues, grants have ranged from pediatric recitation equipment for our community’s first responders to building Avon’s World War II Memorial Park.

The success of Operation Round-Up has all been accomplished with about 2,000 of Hendricks Power’s 30,000 members opting in and rounding up their bills. If every member opted in to the program, Operation Round-Up would generate over \$180,000 each year for community grantmaking.

Partnerships with companies like Hendricks Power Cooperative are valuable to the company, the Community Foundation and to our community. HCCF partners with a variety of local companies in different ways to make positive impact on the lives of people in Hendricks County. Not only do these partnerships expand what HCCF can achieve each year, but they also benefit the company by showing their dedication to their community while gaining valuable insight and expertise from the Community Foundation’s staff. HCCF welcomes the community to also make smaller monthly donations to any of our 200 funds. Small amounts add up to a big impact!

Looking Back: 20^{ANNIVERSARY} Years of Giving



It's our 20th Anniversary,

and we are grateful to see how far we've come! In 1993, most people in our county had no idea what a community foundation was, but a few dedicated citizens with a love and vision for our community opened the Greater Plainfield Community Foundation. Our young organization ran with only volunteers until we hired our first Executive Director in 1994, Deedee Daniel. Deedee recalls feeling overwhelmed with the responsibility of this position for which she had no experience, but at the same time feeling compelled to make this new venture work. Our first office was a 100-square-foot space in the Plainfield Chamber of Commerce building with mismatched pieces of furniture and one old metal desk.

What we lacked in resources, our founders made up for in passion. The first members of the board personally canvassed the county, telling the story of this new foundation and recruiting them as donors, board and advisory members, and volunteers. When we received one of our first grants from Lilly Endowment in 1999, we made grants over \$468,000 to support 6 different local fire departments, the new LINK transportation services for Senior Services, and the brand-new shelter for abused women and children, Sheltering Wings. The foundation grew in assets and county-wide reach and was renamed the White Lick Heritage Community Foundation in 1996. In 2005, the Board of Directors voted unanimously to rename the foundation to clarify our service to the whole county and White Lick Heritage Community Foundation became the Hendricks County Community Foundation.

Jim Spencer, the first president of the Community Foundation in 1996 and one of its founding members in 1993, commented on his amazement at the progress and growth of HCCF over the past 20 years: "From a very small start, the Community Foundation has grown to assets of over \$12.5 million providing grants in 2016 of \$865,000 to programs supporting Hendricks County and scholarships to local students. The hard work and dedication of the staff and board members who have served the Community Foundation during the past 20 years have certainly surpassed any expectations that were established in 1993. It has been my privilege and honor to serve as a small part in the good this foundation has provided to Hendricks County."

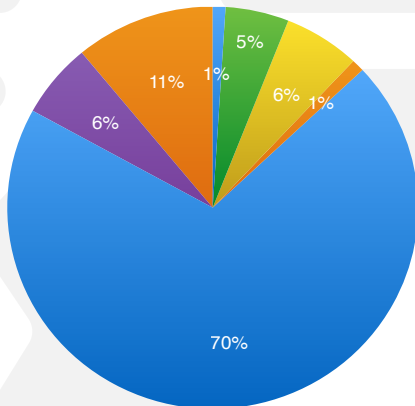

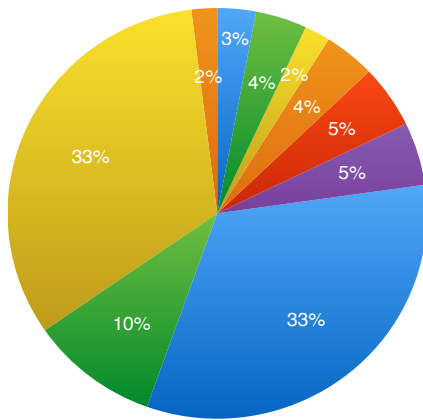
