Final Year of ARPA Funds Awarded

The Community Foundation, in cooperation with the County Council and Commissioners, created a <u>grant program</u> in 2022 to distribute up to \$6.6 million of American Rescue Plan Act funds allotted to Hendricks County. During the first two years of ARPA grants (2022 and 2023), competitive grants totaling **\$1,113,184** were awarded to local nonprofits.



The third and final year of ARPA grant applications closed this past July and the HCCF Program Committee recommended **\$284,485** in competitive grants which will be distributed by December 2024.
