In 2012, the Hendricks County Community Foundation had an exciting year of opening many doors. We have witnessed the start of new funds, made grants and awarded scholarships, and worked as a catalyst and convener within Hendricks County.

The assets of the Community Foundation experienced a strong return on investments, tracking with the markets to an overall gain of 11.4%. This, combined with significant contributions from many generous donors, allowed the Board to approve a variety of grants and scholarships totaling over \$640,000 which benefitted a wide variety of Hendricks County individuals and nonprofits in 2012.

It has also been a year of change. The Community Foundation moved into new offices on US 36 in Avon, identified with prominent signage. We experienced new leadership as well. Executive Director Janet Haley resigned in May to pursue her passion for accounting, and William Rhodehamel joined the Community Foundation as its third Executive Director.

The Board and staff continue to partner to focus on our mission and vision to improve the quality of life in Hendricks County. We are investing in the future, guiding our nonprofit organizations, assisting with charitable projects, and collaborating with others to continue the great work of creating a permanent impact on our community. The Pantries of Nature

One out of every five children in Hendricks County lives in a food-insecure household. Economic hardship has forced some families to skip meals or reduce nutrition below minimal levels. Food pantries supported by the HC Food Pantry Coalition Fund are places where those in need can get canned and packaged goods and staples.

With the help of the HCCF, area hunters and farmers have organized to provide the hungry with fresh, high-protein meat. Created five years ago by Don Emry, the local chapter of Farmers and Hunters Feeding the Hungry (FHFH), coordinates the donation of cattle, pork and venison to the food pantries.

With demand for food increasing each year, Hendricks County FHFH scrambles to keep up, encouraging more hunters and farmers to participate. "We're making progress," said Emry. "We want to make farmers and hunters aware of the need, and how we can help them help others."

They have such a big impact on feeding the hungry in an efficient way, with measurable results. It truly makes for a great partnership."

The collaboration of the Hendricks County Community Foundation, Farmers and Hunters Feeding the Hungry, the Food Pantry Coalition and institutions like the State Bank of Lizton are an example of a community working in tandem to take care of its own.



Hendricks County is a great place to live. In a recent official survey, an impressive 91.9 percent of respondents said they were satisfied with the quality of life here. But how can we ensure it continues to be a great place, and what still needs to be addressed? Are decision-makers in the government, business and nonprofit sectors focused on what's important?

Finding the answers to these questions was the purpose of the 2012 "Hendricks County In Focus" project, supported by the Community Foundation with a three-year \$17,500 grant from the Deedee Daniel Opportunity Fund. The project was the joint effort of more than a dozen county organizations including the HCCF, and spearheaded by the Hendricks County Economic Development Partnership (HCEDP).

The survey was available online, at libraries, agencies and other sites. When the survey was completed, public meetings led to a concrete focus on nine quality-of-life areas: economic growth, education, entertainment, healthcare, housing, parks and green space, public plans for growth, safety, and social services.

"Thanks to the financial support of community entities such as the Community Foundation, we were able to create a baseline for what residents believe is important, to better understand why people live in our community and ensure it continues to be the ideal place to reside," said Cinda Kelley, Executive Director of the HC Economic Development Partnership.

The survey responses were overwhelmingly positive. Topping the list of the county's assets were health services, parks and green space, neighborhood safety and public education. Concerns were expressed about transportation, the capability of infrastructure to keep up with the county's rapid growth and a desire for more high-paying jobs.

"Hendricks County is a great place to live, as this survey indicates," said Cinda. "The responses help us identify opportunities to improve even as we deal with inevitable change. This will make it possible for government, businesses, schools, organizations and other citizens to make decisions about priorities that will help us preserve and invest in the quality of life in Hendricks County in the coming decade."

The Flight of Heroes

Just before Pearl Harbor, *Life Magazine* – one of the most popular and influential of 20th Century America – ran a cover story, "Out to Shake the World," about the then-young generation of Depression-era Americans who were coming of age. They were entering adulthood just in time for history's greatest conflict.

That was almost seven decades ago. Well advanced in years, the dwindling ranks of WWII veterans are finally telling their stories, and the nation recently built, in Washington, D.C., a suitably grand memorial to their service and to the sacrifice of those who never returned – a memorial to those stories.

Indy Honor Flight is a non-profit organization created solely to honor veterans and to fly them free-of-charge to the Washington memorial. It was established in 2012 by Grant and Tammy Thompson as a fund of the Hendricks County Community Foundation. The first flight last September took 80 veterans to the National World War II Memorial and Arlington National Cemetery to be properly honored, reflect on their experience, and remember friends they lost. The second flight was scheduled to transport another 70 veterans as this publication went to press.

Grant Thompson's grandfather passed away before the memorial was finished, "so I took someone else's grandfather and realized I wanted to take many more," he recalls.

But good intentions and a deep commitment were not enough. "We needed help. The HCCF came to our rescue. It gave instant credibility to Indy Honor Flight and allowed our donors to easily contribute to this great cause," he said. "I realized that the HCCF could get this moving."


The local veterans found themselves overwhelmed with applause and appreciation when they visited the Memorial, and greeted by a cheering crowd upon their return to Indiana. "That was the greatest day of my life," said an emotional ex-Marine.

Just as *Life Magazine* predicted, they truly did "shake the world." But little did the writers know that those "young people" would someday be known as The Greatest Generation.

The Path to Success

Whether it's figuring out the next step after high school graduation or going back to school years later to change your career, the Hendricks College Network (HCN) does everything but take the courses for you.

An educational network that helps to ensure access to post-secondary education, business training, and workforce development, the HCN offers workshops and personal counseling on financial aid, admissions, graduate school, skill and trade apprenticeships and alternatives to traditional training, like the military.

"We're meeting a serious need for those who want to consider all options for post-secondary education," said Interim Executive Director Brandy Perrill. "Sometimes it's just connecting them to a community resource for on-the-job training in the field they want to pursue."

In 2012 alone, the HCN served nearly 12,000 individuals wanting to enroll in college, develop business skills or secure financial aid. As the HCN's partner, the Hendricks County Community Foundation provides financial support and input.

An HCCF grant last year allowed the HCN to purchase a digital student management system.

"It was terrific at the College Fair; we can access it on the go, which enables us to more easily provide information all over the county," Brandy said.



Partnering with the Hendricks County Community Foundation, the Hendricks College Network has assisted local families in navigating the daunting landscape of financial aid applications. People wait in line to get into the Community Foundation's FAFSA Days at Hendricks County high schools, where they are guided through the application process one-on-one by experts from National Center of College Costs.

The FAFSA Days held this February (2013) helped local families find \$723,671 in financial aid – a jump of \$66,000 over the previous year. "Knowing how to properly apply for financial aid can make the difference between going to college or not," said Brandy. The HCN's 2013 College Fair attracted more than 500 people who wanted to learn about college admissions, and nearly every Indiana institution of higher education was on hand.

"When we put our heads together with the HCCF, we come up with great ideas on scholarship initiatives and how to help more people," said Brandy. "I go home every day knowing that we helped connect someone with all the options for their future."

The Power of Teams

The single mom was pleased by her daughter's request to play organized softball, but taken aback by the cost. "I'm an attorney and I could manage it," recalls Amy Comer Elliott. "But I thought, what do other single parents or families with tight budgets do when their kids ask to take part in something as positive as team sports?"

At the time, she was in the middle of reading "The Purpose Driven Life" by Rick Warren, "and it all came together," Amy recalls. "I saw the need, and I needed to act."

With just four donations totaling \$1,000, she went to the Hendricks County Community Foundation to start a local fund, Sports For All Kids.

Nine years later, the Sports For All Kids Fund annually opens the door to team sports for 75 to 100 K-8th grade boys and girls in Danville who otherwise would not be able to participate in baseball, softball, basketball, football, cheerleading, swimming and wrestling. The youth leagues help the Fund expand its reach by offering reduced fees to the Sports For All Kids players.

Amy certainly had a great idea with a great purpose. But without the Hendricks County Community Foundation, it might never have touched the lives of so many Danville kids.

"There's no way I could have done it otherwise," she said. "If I had to apply for my own 501(c)(3) nonprofit status, it wouldn't have happened; that's a very complicated and expensive process. With the HCCF, you don't need to go through all that to establish a Fund. Plus the HCCF manages the Fund so you can concentrate on your role as the founder and fundraiser."

That's the power of teams. In sports and in our community.

The Tunnel of Art

When first acquired as part of the land for the B&O Trail, the tunnel beneath the Ronald Reagan Parkway was merely a convenient bypass to the other side of the highway. Its plain cement surfaces didn't stay bare for long – obscene graffiti soon defaced the tunnel and hampered the enjoyment of families and runners on the trail.

The graffiti would have to be painted over, of course. But Diana Virgil & her B&O Trail Association committee converted the problem to an asset. All that surface surrounding hikers and runners could be an attractive feature of the trail, not just a cement tube covered in paint. And so the B&O Tunnel under Reagan Parkway (one of two on the trail) features a variety of bright panels from local artists – all protected by a special anti-graffiti coating purchased with a 2012 grant from the Deedee Daniel Opportunity Fund. The Fund awarded another grant last year for continued expansion of the trail, and at the time this Report went to print, Diana announced the purchase of the trail's first section of land west of the tunnel.

Meanwhile, artists both amateur and professional are clamoring to be part of the new underground "art gallery" on the B&O Trail. "We have too many requests!" Diana said. "We have a number of spaces assigned for high school classes, and another to an artist who will contribute a painting honoring our military."

One of the current panels was created by young students from the Artistic Designs Gallery in Brownsburg, who studied Van Gogh's grid techniques to enlarge and paint student Will Copeland's winning design on a large tunnel panel.

The youngsters each helped paint the mural, guided by their teacher Laura Tesdahl, and proudly signed their names.




