We also hope you'll consider giving back to HCCF. Over the past year the Hendricks County Community Foundation continued our work to make our community a better place. We've conducted a comprehensive behavioral health survey leading to a community-wide plan, refreshed the data in our 2019 Needs Assessment, and partnered with county government to distribute \$6.6 million in American Rescue Plan grants to nonprofits working in our community. And we made important grants throughout the year to support many charitable projects and programs making a difference in our community.

HCCF Helps Distribute \$6.6 Million in ARPA Funds

HCCF partnered with the Hendricks County Commissioners and Council to assist with the distribution of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to nonprofits working in Hendricks County. Over the past 8 months, HCCF has designed and conducted a grant application process to distribute up to \$6.6 million of these funds.

HCCF and the ARPA Planning Committee recommended noncompetitive grants of

approximately \$5 million for community organizations that, along with their clients, were most affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Through an open application process, the HCCF Program Committee also recommended an additional \$500,000 in competitive grants in November 2022. Over the next two years, \$800,000 more in competitive grants will be offered. See the list of recipient organizations [here](#).

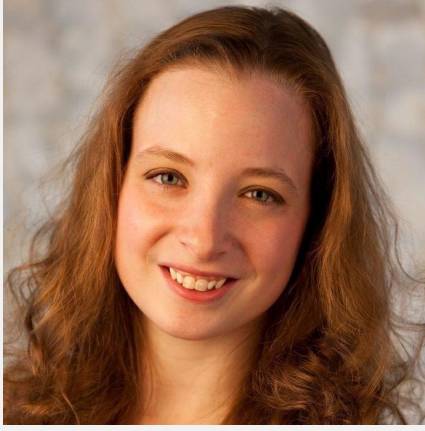

The [B&O Trail Assoc.](#) celebrated a groundbreaking on November 9 for its newest trail section, which

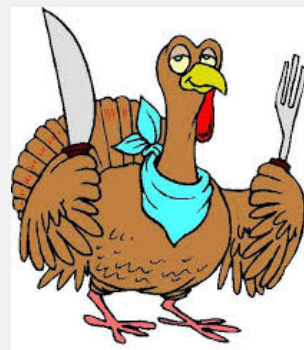
