There were very few youth activities. I was embarrassed to tell people where I lived, because of the stigma connected to my community. I remember thinking no one cares. The stigma of unhealthy addiction can create a number of barriers. It can cause a person to suffer in many other ways.

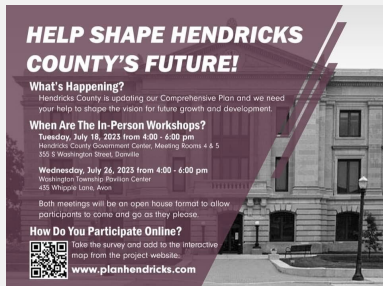
Hendricks County cannot turn a blind eye to what is happening with the drug epidemic in our schools and community. We can help our residents by asking those uncomfortable questions. Show them that we care, by offering support. The reality is our unhealthy addicted population is growing rapidly. We need to be fast and strategic to mitigate future issues our youth will face. We can begin by asking youth what they want. Offer ways to combat current and future crises. As a child, I recall feeling like I was suffocating, with nowhere to go. We can continue to financially support local organizations that service youth and offer community programming. Local organizations can play an important role in helping us foster pathways to a healthy community and youth.

Why do you do what you do? As the Executive Director of a local non-profit The Miles We Walk, I get to share and connect with others. I'm able to spend time with people who may be looking for a second chance at life or who may have a loved one with an addiction and/or a mental disorder. If my son

D'Mile's personal life struggles can help someone, I enjoy saying his name, and assisting others to create their pathway to success through our workshops. I get to encourage people to start a new beginning. Facing losing D'Mile had to be by far the toughest moment in my life. Death showed up and took what belonged to me. It's about what you do with these energies. Yes, the spirit of death is paralyzing, but I knew it was up to me to keep D'Mile's legacy aLIVE.

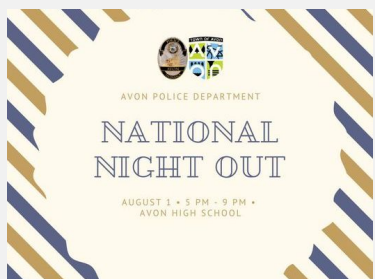
Fave Five #1: Make Your Voice Heard!
