# Hendricks County Community Foundation

Last week, I was pleased to attend the groundbreaking for the Plainfield Performing and Fine Arts Center. The new facility, being constructed as part of the Plainfield Civic Center at the corner of Main and Center Streets in downtown Plainfield, is intended to be an arts and civic hub for all of our community.

HCCF has been proud to partner with the Town of Plainfield to incubate Hendricks Live!, the new nonprofit arts and entertainment organization that will operate and develop the programming for the Center. We entered into a fiscal sponsorship agreement with the Town last October, and then worked with the steering committee to hire Chris Petrelli, who is the Executive Director of Hendricks Live! (Chris is actually an employee of HCCF, and will be until the organization gains independent status!).

Fiscal sponsorships like this are one of the unique and flexible tools HCCF has to realize our mission of making Hendricks County a better place. We're able to handle the money for an important project or emerging nonprofit until they develop the capacity to become independent. Nonprofits working in our area that have grown out of fiscal sponsorships here at HCCF include Family Promise of Hendricks County and Indy Honor Flight. We're proud to have helped these nonprofits come to fruition, as we are with Hendricks Live!

## Working towards Better Community Mental Health



HCCF is excited to partner with Community Solutions to engage Hendricks County stakeholders to work collaboratively and strategically to improve the behavioral health outcomes of Hendricks County residents. The work will include gathering key data, engaging cross-sector leaders and facilitating the development of a community-wide plan to ensure that all Hendricks County residents have access to healthcare and wellness services and supports and experience optimal health and well-being.

This project works in two stages. The first is planning, in which cross-sector leaders are engaged to develop a community plan on behavioral health. The second is implementation, where funds are set aside to support putting the plan in motion.



### Fave Five #1: Murphy Aquatic Park Now Open!


