There are many things about HCCF that make me proud: our effective grantmaking, generous donors, important partnerships, dedicated volunteers, knowledgeable professional staff, and our role as a community leader. The last is especially important because it allows us to address key issues in our community. One recent activity led to us addressing a key issue that we've identified as a challenge. That issue was our scholarship application process for the <u>Lilly</u> <u>Endowment Community Scholarship</u>.

It had reasonable criteria, was accessible and open to all high school seniors. The problem was in the results: our recipients over the 25 years did not reflect our community, both in lack of men and students of color. So HCCF put together a task force made up of Board members, scholarship recipients, county high school and higher education representatives, and other community stakeholders. Led by HCCF's Vice President of Programs Eric Hessel and Community Inclusion & Engagement Manager Bryan Chatfield, the task force did a deep dive over four months into our application process and the best practices from the field to develop a recommendation for our Board. I was able to sit in on a couple of the meetings and found them to be among the most thoughtful and engaging conversations in my 11 years with HCCF.

The changes to the criteria and application have been approved by the HCCF Board, and Independent Colleges of Indiana, which oversees the program for Lilly Endowment. You can read more about the changes below, but our hope is that more of our high school seniors will apply for this important scholarship. And I know that HCCF will continue to lead on important issues in our community.

### **HCCF Completes Comprehensive Review of Scholarship Process**

HCCF recently completed a comprehensive review of our scholarship program. This initiative is a testament to the HCCF's ongoing commitment to supporting equitable educational opportunities for aspiring scholars in Hendricks County.

In prior years, the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship in Hendricks County has primarily focused on Community Service, Leadership and High School Activities with a final determination at an interview. The updated program balances Outside School Activities, School Activities, Academics, Financial Need, and Unique Circumstances outside of a student's control. The final determination will still be based on an interview.

### **ARPA Grant Applications Close July 4th**

HCCF is working with the Hendricks County Commissioners to assist with the distribution of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to nonprofits working in Hendricks County. Working with the county's ARPA Planning Committee, the



Community Foundation designed a process to distribute approximately \$1.5 million through a three-year competitive grant cycle, approximately \$500,000 each year.

The first grant cycle was completed in 2022. The application process for the second grant cycle of competitive grants is open now until July 4. Learn more here.
