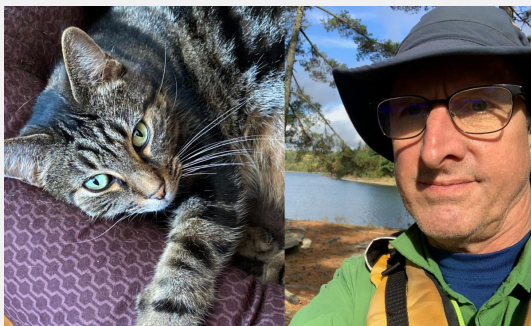

I wouldn't want him to feel left out and retaliate with his notorious feline temper! Buster is a beautiful DSH brown tabby with an incredibly soft coat that you could easily spend all day petting. He came into our lives in 2015 as a stray, turning up at our backdoor with plaintive cries and quickly made himself at home.

Buster, like many cats, seeks attention on his own terms. Most of the time, he's content to be left alone, but when he does want affection, he demands it in no uncertain terms. He'll jump up on the bed, running the dogs off in the process, and insist on being petted.
