Their mission? That no one gets forgotten.

In 1998, after a local veteran passed away, there were no plans to honor him for his service, and there was no organization with the capability to do so. A group of individuals unhappy about this situation came together and began the work of becoming an official nonprofit Honor Guard with the purpose of honoring those who have served in the United States armed forces.



The group got started as soon as they could and received full nonprofit status in 2001. Wanting to present the upmost respect, the group went through training with the Department of Defense to become certified. From the early stages they had two needs to make their organization a success: supplies and individuals passionate about their cause. To honor a veteran properly, they need at least six people present at each memorial service, along with proper attire and equipment. In 2001 they applied for their first grant from HCCF for their most basic need: matching military uniforms.

Since 2001 this volunteer group has served and honored over 784 individuals during their final rites. The uniform and equipment for a single Honor Guard member costs \$800. The uniforms were a great first step but certainly not their only need as they are out in the unpredictable Indiana weather. A few years ago another grant was made to help the Guard protect themselves from the elements.

“That’s where you guys [HCCF] came in - providing funds for us to purchase rain coats and hats. We could be out in January and February for over an hour in snow and cold,” said Hendricks County Honor Guard Board Member Thomas Wallace. The most recent grant made to the Honor Guard in 2015 was a matching grant opportunity. The grant provided each member of the Guard with shoes as well as leather harnesses for flags. “HCCF is so grateful for the work the Hendricks County Honor Guard does honoring our veterans. Our Grants Committee believes that every veteran should be given this honor and is proud to provide funding so that the Honor Guard can do so in the most professional and proper way,” said Program Officer Eric Hessel.

The group of volunteers that make up the Hendricks County Honor Guard are focused on being a true last rite for military veterans. They focus on being the best and take great pride in their work because they are the last thing the veteran’s family sees as their loved one is laid to rest. They hope to continue their work for many years to come and are grateful for the support they have received along the way. “The support of the Hendricks County Community Foundation has been amazing. You’ve clothed us and made sure we had proper equipment. It is truly unbelievable what HCCF has done for us,” said Wallace.

The
Comer
Family

*Growing up, I was
raised with a
sense of giving back.*



When a family has its roots in a community for over 100 years they call that place home. And “home” is the word the Comer family uses to describe Hendricks County – the whole county. They moved to Hendricks County in the 1940s and the family business, Abstract and Title, opened on the Danville Square in 1956. Mary Lee Comer served as a Hendricks County judge for over 18 years. Her husband, Lee, and their son Ben and daughter Amy, have all been instrumental in zoning and development all across the county. While the Comers have been active in the local business community and in government, their family’s biggest passion is giving back to the home that has given them so much.

Mary Lee and Lee have always had a focus on giving back. Mary Lee explains, “Growing up, I was raised with a sense of giving back. We were very poor, but Dad always tithed. I learned to give back from him. We have been very blessed, and when you reach that point, it is your role to help others. We believe you have a responsibility to pay it forward no matter what.”

The Comer story is one of a family that has worked together to make several charitable dreams a reality and they have partnered with the Hendricks County Community Foundation to do it. They have established three separate and unique funds that highlight the family’s various passions and desires to give back.

Sports For All Kids



Sports For All Kids was created by Amy in 2004. As a single mother with kids in local sports leagues, Amy realized the financial challenge it was for some families with their children participating in sports. Sports For All Kids was established to make sure every kid from Danville who wanted to participate in a local sport would have that opportunity.

The initial supplies and materials were funded by four local businessmen, but from there Amy knew it was important to be designated as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization in order to accept tax-deductible donations. Amy did not have the time or resources to apply for her nonprofit designation, but she was familiar with the Hendricks County Community Foundation. Together Amy and HCCF set up the Sports For All Kids Fund, a nonpermanent fiscal sponsorship fund, to allow the program to operate under HCCF's nonprofit status and make her charitable passion a reality. "HCCF made it so easy, and being under their umbrella allows me to offer charitable deductions to donors. None of this would have happened without HCCF," said Amy.

Sports For All Kids has funded over 1,000 registration fees for Danville youth. Mary Lee and Lee are proud of Amy and the Sports For All Kids Fund: "We have supported Sports For All Kids through the years, and we are very proud of Amy for pioneering this great work. People often think of food and shelter as basic needs but forget that children need to be social and active. This fund is a small yet impactful way of meeting those needs. This cause has truly been a family affair and passion. All of the family has been a part of making this organization a success."

Comer Family Leadership Fund

Lee helped start Leadership Hendricks County (LHC) in 1993. Since then, LHC has given citizens the background and insider information they need to take on effective leadership roles in Hendricks County. The Comers are passionate about the benefits the program provides to the county. Ben sees the positive impact LHC has in the community, "To grow as a community, we have to break down social walls and work together. LHC puts people in a position to work together for the good of Hendricks County."

Out of the passion the Comers has for LHC, they decided to create a designated endowed fund at HCCF to provide a grant to LHC that will support one class member's participation in the adult program. The Comer Family Leadership grant supports someone in realty, banking or in a need-based situation because "the real estate industry has been good to us."

Lee spoke to a confidence he has with HCCF managing this fund and the purpose behind it. "I have seen the good that HCCF does in the community and the expertise they bring to what they do. We want this fund to ensure that knowledgeable people are able to get into LHC."

Susan Rozzi, Executive Director of Leadership Hendricks County, shared, "The Comer family is helping develop

leaders for Hendricks County and ensuring the long-term sustainability of our program by this generous gift. We could not be more appreciative of their partnership and support."

Comer Family Legacy Fund

In 2015 the Comers created a Family Legacy Fund as a way to give back in a lasting and meaningful way. Mary Lee and Lee are passionate that it is their responsibility as a family to pay their blessings forward.

"We trust the vetting that HCCF provides in choosing which organizations and projects to fund. Our fund, along with the other Family Legacy and unrestricted funds, will allow HCCF to make a bigger difference in our community," Amy said.

Family Legacy Funds are unrestricted funds and make grants determined by HCCF. The Comers have resolved as a family to be part of something bigger to support organizations and projects here in Hendricks County. The pool of all Legacy Funds will have a profound impact for generations. HCCF uses unrestricted funds to address the greatest needs and opportunities in the community and has the flexibility to change those as needs change. In 2015, HCCF developed a new unrestricted grantmaking program that focuses on nonprofit capacity, their ability to run as effectively and efficiently as possible. Funding will provide for a monthly learning series, free to nonprofits serving Hendricks County; grants for professional development and capital purchases; and project-based funding for projects like public art, parks and historical preservation.

This family may one day move from the community they call home, but their passion to make a difference and to pay it forward never will. "We want to officially leave our mark. We don't know what tomorrow will bring, but this fund will be here, doing good forever," said Ben.
