Childcare

For Families:

SBA's Disaster Assistance Loan offers small businesses working capital up to \$2M to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that can't be paid because of the disaster's impact.

<u>United Way</u> has deployed a <u>Central Indiana Community Economic Relief Fund</u> of \$16.5M for organizations that fall into the human services category.
