# Where Local Good Grows Hendricks County Community Foundation

I've been digging into the recently-released 2020 US Census results for Hendricks County. I'm a data guy, so this information is fascinating for me. Did you know that our county grew 19.1% since the last census in 2010? That means we've now got over 177,000 fellow neighbors in our county today! When I moved into the county in 1990 there were only 75,700 residents – that's some change in population in 30 years!

The demographic information is fascinating too. Our non-white population is now 15.5% of residents. In 2010 that number was under 10% (these and other details of the Census data can be found at **Stats Indiana**).

What this data tells me is that Hendricks County continues to grows rapidly, and is becoming a much more vibrant, diverse community. We're projected to continue to grow, adding perhaps 20% or 30% again in the next 10 years. I think this makes even more clear the importance of all our residents feeling welcome, heard and valued in our community. HCCF continues our work in this area as part of our Community Unity efforts, work that flowed from our 2019 Needs Assessment. We hope you'll join us as we continue this important work.

As we head into the latter part of the year, I also hope you'll include HCCF in your **year-end giving**. Won't you help support all the important work we do in the community?
