# **Celebrating Our 25th Anniversary!**

In honor of our 25th anniversary, HCCF is awarding \$25,000 in grants to organizations all across Hendricks County, 13 of which represent grant recipients receiving inaugural grants in 1996. We are excited to tell you about two of our anniversary grantees:



HCCF awarded an anniversary grant to the St. Marks Episcopal Food Outreach Program in honor of the Community Foundation's first Board Chair, Jim Spencer.

St. Mark's Episcopal Church is located in Plainfield but also serves Avon, Brownsburg, Mooresville and the surrounding communities.

The food program is just one of many services the church offers to the community along with Sunday services, educational opportunities for all ages, and a variety of outreach and social activities.



To commemorate HCCF's Silver Anniversary and invest in the future of our county, HCCF made an anniversary grant to the Hendricks County Tricentennial Fund, held here at the Community Foundation.

This Community Enhancement Fund was created in 2018 by HCCF to commemorate Hendricks County's Bicentennial in 2016. HCCF will grant \$1000 annually to the fund for 100 years where it can then make grants to meet community needs at that time.
