- Addressing the Needs: A Conversation on Community Unity January 8 and 9, 2020
 - If no dialogue let's people to come their own conclusions
 - Operate cohesively but also respectful of differences
 - Decrease in community unity don't feel included
 - Like on cruise ship all going in same direction but different activities
 - Need opportunity to participate in different activities – same in community
 - Lack of unity seen in politics, referendums
 - Level of distrust
 - Information lost or misunderstood
