IPA Week on the Hill

Last week, HCCF Vice President of Programs, Eric Hessel, attended Indiana Philanthropy Associations' Foundations on the Hill in Washington D.C. FOTH is an annual advocacy opportunity for IPA members to meet with their federal lawmakers at their Washington, D.C. offices about the policies that matter most to our sector and advocate on behalf of the philanthropic sector.

The current bill in the Senate includes a new tiered tax on foundations' investment income, a minimum giving threshold that could discourage some corporate donations, and new rules concerning income from activities unrelated to an organization's primary mission, which could reduce funds available for programs.

Our Favorite Five in Hendricks County

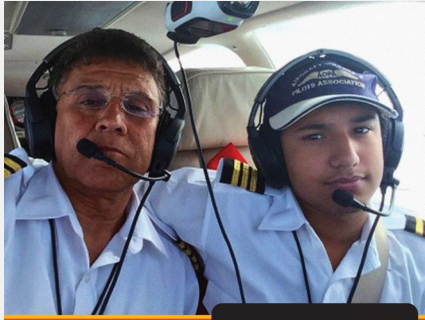
It has finally stopped raining! Time to get out and enjoy events around town! Here are your Community Foundation staff's favorite picks for happenings around the community:
