In February, we award grants from all our permanent, endowed Designated Funds. <u>Designated Funds</u> are those that donors create to support a specific nonprofit organization forever. It's a way to turn one's monthly or annual giving to a nonprofit into forever giving. So HCCF sends checks – over \$300,000 in 2023 – to support those nonprofits and their work in our community. Our donors have started funds to support a wide range of community organizations, ranging from libraries, schools and churches, to our youth and social service organizations.

One of our newest Designated funds is the Willard Lydick Memorial Vocation Agricultural Education Fund. This fund was started by his family to honor the late Mr. Lydick and to provide support to the Future Farmers of America (FFA) Program in Mill Creek Schools with a preference for students facing financial barriers to participation. HCCF is making a grant from this fund this month to Cascade High School. When the Agriculture Educator at Cascade was notified, she stated, "That is great, thank you! We often have students who aren't sure about signing up because of the fee associated with membership." That's a perfect expression of our donors' intent matching a need in the community!
