

What do you love most about our community? I love our parks! I have a toddler, and I am amazed at how many wonderful playgrounds we have in Hendricks County, in addition to the amazing bike trails and hiking paths.

What is one need identified in HCCF's countywide assessment that we are addressing? How can we continue to improve? One of the biggest issues facing our community is lack of affordable/attainable housing. As a part of the Hendricks County Workforce Barriers Housing Taskforce, I'm excited about creative solutions to the housing problem that many organizations across are collaborating on, including the neighborhood development project that my congregation, Avon Christian Church, and Habitat for Humanity are currently working together on. There is definitely room for a lot of

improvement though- there are some in our community who are weary of affordable housing and take a "not in my backyard" stance. The reality is that so many people in our community are impacted by this barrier- it's our teachers, hospital workers, fire fighters, grocery workers, and more who give so much to our community but cannot afford to live here. If we can work together to break down that mindset, even more collaboration can happen to help solve this problem.

Why do you do what you do? I take Jesus' command to love God and love neighbor seriously. I believe that by serving, welcoming, and loving others we bring God's kingdom into the here and now and shine God's light into our community.
